Goal

The library's goal is to meet the community's needs within the framework of a responsible budget.

Your library: a gathering place where you can learn, grow, and enjoy.

The 2019-20 budget

Total Budget = \$641,307.06

Total Proposed Tax Levy = \$453,695 (\$30,000 increase from 2018-19)



Cost to the taxpayer

The tax rate is projected* to increase by approximately 5 cents per thousand of assessed valuation. For Gloversville homes, total taxes are projected to increase as follows based on home values:

Home Value	Annual Total Tax Increase	
\$50,000	\$2.50	
\$100,000	\$5.00	
\$150,000	\$7.50	

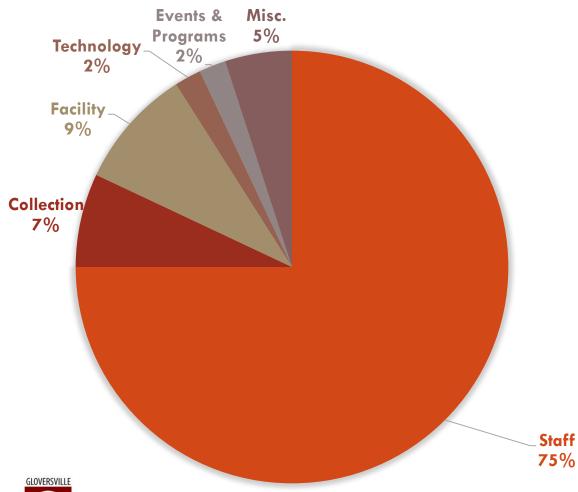
*Final tax rates are set in August once final equalization rates are provided by the state.

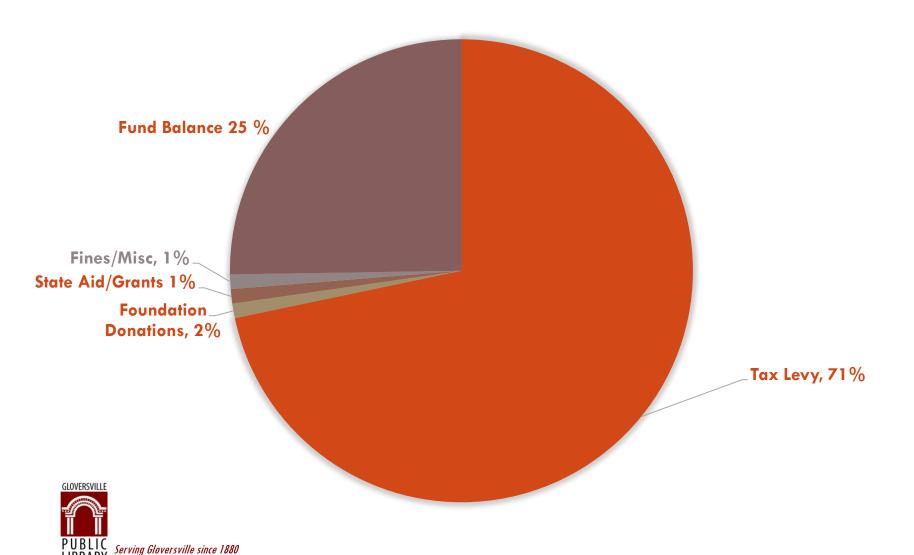

- Staff: Full-time & part-time library staff, benefits, Social Security, etc.
- Collection: Books, magazines, newspapers, books-on-CD, eFormats, & DVDs
- Facility: Utilities, insurance, maintenance
- Technology: Computer equipment, supplies & network access
- Events & Programs: Public programs and promotion expenses
- Misc: supplies, professional fees, election expenses, other

During that time, the Foundation's annual contribution to the library will be eliminated or greatly reduced.
