# Public Hearing 2023-2024 Budget



#### Goal

The Library's goal is to meet the community's evolving needs during this challenging time, and to do so within the framework of a responsible budget.





### The 2023-2024 Budget

Total Budget = \$1,008,192

Total Proposed Tax Levy = \$613,695 (\$60,000 increase from 2022-23)



### Cost to the GESD Taxpayer

The tax rate is projected\* to increase by approximately 8 cents per thousand of assessed valuation. For Gloversville homes, total taxes are projected to increase as follows, based on home values:

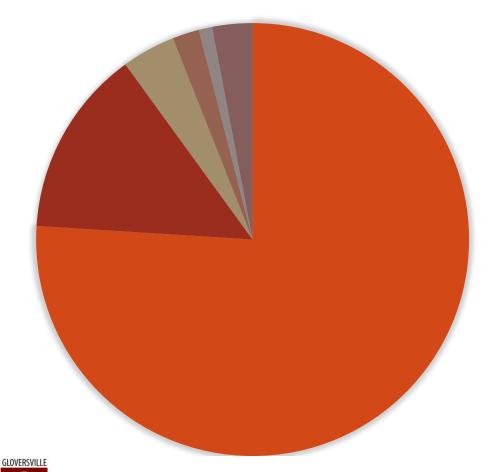

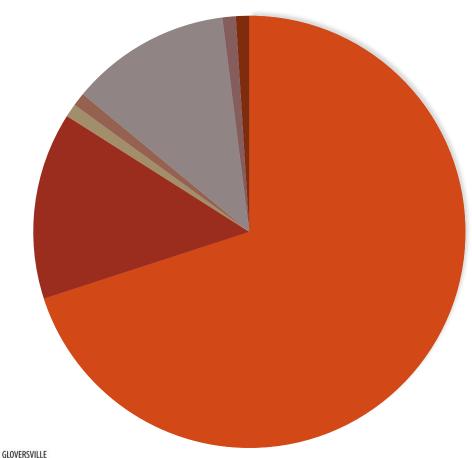


#### 2023-2024 Expenses



- Staff: 76%
   Full-time & part-time library staff, benefits, Social Security, etc.
- Facility: 14%
   Utilities, insurance, maintenance
- Collection: 4%
   Books, magazines, newspapers, audiobooks, ebooks/emagazines, DVDs, library of things
- Technology: 2%
   Computer equipment, supplies & network access
- Programs & Promotion: 1%
   Public programs, events, and promotion expenses
- Misc: 3%
   Supplies, professional fees, election expenses, other

## Staff salaries, benefits and related expenses are 76% percent of the budget

The staff has drastically reimagined library services and offerings during the pandemic, so that we can reach more people, in more ways. Whether in the building, online, or out in the community, the staff provides essential access to information and entertainment — keeping Gloversville citizens connected to each other and the world at large.

#### The Challenge:

- Minimum wage will continue to increase an over the next few years, until it reaches the State-mandated \$15/hour, affecting our salaries
- Minimum wage January 2014 = \$8/hourMinimum wage January 2023 = \$14.20/hourPercent increase: 65%
- Additional part-time staff is included in the budget to qualify for additional grant revenue

The library's recent renovation was fully funded with private donations and grant money. Although the construction is over, the grant funds are still in the lengthy process of being reimbursed. So, while we are proud that no tax dollars were used to provide Gloversville the 21st century cornerstone facility the community needs and deserves, the library's bottom line remains impacted while we wait for reimbursements to be secured. Despite this challenge, the staff is committed to expanding services and increasing offerings, while keeping costs to the community at a minimum.





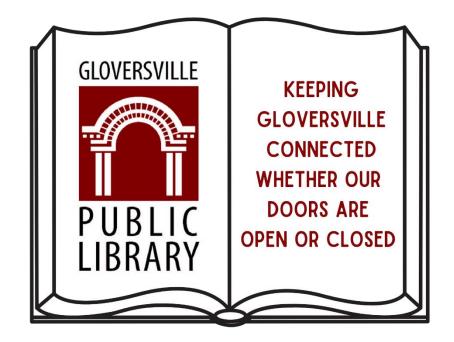
